CAMPUS:

Tamiscal High School was established in 1990 as an independent study high school and includes TEAM, a one-year outdoor/experiential program for 24 juniors. Tamiscal also includes 22 senior students enrolled in Pathways, a program that blends contained classroom instruction, College of Marin classes and participation in an internship. The Tamiscal independent study students participate in an academic program comparable to that in the comprehensive high schools in the district. Students must take a minimum of four academic subjects at Tamiscal and must complete at least five hours of work per subject per week. A typical schedule requires attendance a minimum of two days per week. Some Tamiscal students are also enrolled in pre-professional training programs in dance, music, drama, or sports such as tennis or skating that preclude full-time attendance at a comprehensive high school. Tamiscal's staff includes a principal, 12 teachers, a counseling department with four part-time counselors – academic, college and career and personal, a para-educator and a clerical support staff of two. All teachers are very experienced and highly qualified in their subject areas.

COMMUNITY:

Tamiscal High is located just 11 miles north of San Francisco in beautiful Marin County. As one of the five schools in the Tamalpais Union High School District, Tamiscal enrolls students from the southern Marin county communities that reach from the Golden Gate Bridge north to Central Marin and west to the ocean.
